Research fields:

Analysis and identification of enabling and inhibiting factors of various forms innovations (i.e. product, service, business practice, marketing, organisational) characterising both manufacturing and public sectors. Evaluating the roles of the various forms of knowledge in the organisations (e.g. code – tacit, individual – collective) and demonstrating how they shape the innovation-learning capabilities of the organisation.

Comparing forms of work-organisations (from innovative-learning organisation to taylorized forms of organisations) using the various European data-set of the European Surveys (e.g. EWCS, CIS, etc.).

In relation with the importance of the non-technological innovations, special focus devoted to the design and implementations (dissemination) of the so-called High-Performance or Involvement Working Systems (HPWS), Employees Driven Innovation (EDI) etc.

Core aims of the research group activity is to demonstrate the interaction between innovation, job quality and employment and preparing recommendations for policy makers based on national and international research evidences.
